The 1er Cru Vaucoupin site, taken from atop of the parcel of land. Note the steeply sloping, slightly concave features, which contribute to the wine's consistent density and concentration.



A fifty year old vine in the Vaucoupin, planted in a white limestone soil, as is evident from the rocks. The racy minerality of Chablis derives from these soils.



The entrance to an ancient "cabane" for vineyard workers in the Vaucoupin. The stones are pure limestone taken from just outside the vineyard area.
